If you have any questions, please contact the appropriate building.



Hep B The minimum age for the 3rd dose of Hepatitis B is 24 weeks of age.

DTaP Four doses of DTaP/DTP/DT are acceptable if 4th dose was administered on or after child's fourth birthday.

Polio Three doses of polio vaccine are acceptable for all grade levels if the 3rd dose was administered on or after child's fourth birthday and at lease 6 months after the previous





dose with only one type of vaccine used (all IPV or all OPV).

For students in grades kindergarten through 5th grade the final dose must be administered on or after the 4th birthday, and be administered **at least 6 months** after the previous dose.

Varicella Physician documentation of disease history, including month and year, is proof of immunity for children entering preschool, kindergarten through 7th grade. Parental report of disease history is acceptable for grades 8□12.

MCV4 Individuals who receive dose 1 on or after their 16th birthday only need 1 dose of MCV4.

Hep A The minimum interval between 1st and 2nd dose of Hepatitis A is 6 calendar months. K-3rd grade is required. *For grades 4-11, two doses of Hep A are recommended. For 12th grade, 2 doses are required.

Medications at School

If your child has any medication at school (Elementary, Middle School, or High School), you may go to school on the last day -May 24 -to pick it up. If you would like your child to transport it home, you must fill out the form at the bottom and return to school. When school is out, if the medication has not been picked up, it will be destroyed. This also includes "over the counter" medications/inhalers, Epi-Pens, eye drops, etc. If you have further questions, please contact Mrs. Mellon at 567-9741. Thanks and have a great summer.

**Over the summer would be a great time to check with your family physician or the County Health Nurse to see if your child is in need of any further immunizations. Always ask for a copy to give to the school nurse. Clinics in July and August tend to be the busiest. Get your kindergarten, 6th and 12th grade immunizations before these months to avoid possible long waits! Check the immunization schedule to be sure your child/children have all their needed immunizations. The State Dept. of Health has added more requirements for grades 6 and 12. Children are to be "up to date" when school starts in August. Religious Objections must be filled out each school year on each child not immunized. Medical/Religious Exemption

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Your child has a medical/religious exemption to vaccination and is not fully immunized. Although your child remains at risk for getting a vaccine preventable disease, IC 20-34-4 permits your child to attend school.

In the event of an outbreak of a vaccine preventable disease for which your child is not fully vaccinated, your child may be excluded from school to protect his/her health and the health of all our students and staff. It is important to understand that with some diseases such as measles, one infected child is an outbreak. The length of time your child will be kept out of school depends on the disease. Your child's exclusion may be as long as 3-4 weeks.

If your child is excluded from school, your child will also be excluded from school sponsored activities, such as sporting events, dances, and graduation that occur within the exclusion period. The school will notify you when your child can return to school.

Incompletely vaccinated children can be excluded from school due to cases of measles, chickenpox, pertussis, mumps, or any other vaccine preventable disease (at the discretion of the local health officer).

Acknowledgement of Consequences of Incomplete Vaccination

I understand that my child may be excluded from school in the event of an outbreak of a vaccine preventable disease.

I understand that school exclusion includes after-school activities, such as sporting events, dances, and graduation.

I understand that my child may be required to stay home for multiple weeks during an outbreak of a vaccine preventable disease for which he/she is not vaccinated.


EXEMPTION FOR IMMUNIZATIONS

The Indiana State Department of Health will allow objections to immunizations to be raised on the following grounds:

Medical- A physicians' certification that a particular immunization is or may be detrimental to the child's health is required. This must be in writing from the physician (M.D., D.O., or Nurse Practitioner), signed by the parents and renewed on a yearly basis.

Religious- A written statement that the objection to immunizations is based on religious grounds is required. This must be signed by the parents and renewed on a yearly basis.

In the state of Indiana there is no exemption allowed for philosophical objections. Most WC students will know what level they are in. If you are new to the program, this information may help you determine what level your child is in. All students learn differently and at different paces, if we feel a child is in the wrong level we will correct it. All students attending swim lessons are required to wear a swim cap. Caps are worn for several different reasons, the colors help us identify quickly if a child is a safe swimmer or not. Caps also help keep our pool water clean when several students are using it at one time.

CAPS WILL NEED TO BE PURCHASED IF YOU DO NOT HAVE ONE. CAP COST IS \$2.00

Level 2 - yellow cap

Swimmer cannot float, submerge face, retrieve object from pool bottom or jump from diving board. To pass onto green cap the swimmer must be able to perform these skills.

Level 3- green cap

Swimmer is able to use arms and legs to advance themselves through the water. They are able to jump into deep water, come to the surface and safely swim to the side. Swimmer begins the skills set on strokes other than front crawl.

Level 4 - blue cap

Swimmer is able to perform front crawl and elementary backstroke with ease. Diving and underwater swimming are at a safe level. They begin to learn more advanced strokes such as breaststroke and butterfly.

Level 5 - red cap

Swimmer has accomplished skills for advanced strokes. They now begin to work on breath control, endurance and swimming laps.

Level 6 - purple cap

All strokes have been mastered. Swimmer will have several tests on endurance and lap swimming.

JGUARD - students interested in taking this course must be at a purple cap level. Students 5th-8th grade may attend this course. They will learn life saving skills such as CPR and rescue breathing. Swimmers will learn the correct way to save someone if they are drowning and identify someone in need of help.







Facts About Music Education.

- Children who study a musical instrument are more likely to excel in all of their studies, work better in teams, have enhanced critical thinking skills, stay in school, and pursue further education.
- Schools with music programs have an estimated 90.2% graduation rate and 93.9% attendance rate compared to schools without music education, which average 72.9% graduation and 84.9% attendance.
- Increased coordination: Students who practice with musical instruments can improve their hand-eye coordination. Just like playing sports, children can develop motor skills when playing music.
